### PLAYER TO WATCH



Bemidji State senior captain **Travis Winter** has had more success than any other player currently on the BSU roster. In just five games the forward has three goals and two assists.

## THE GAME

The Bemidji State University men's ice hockey team breaks the seal on its 53rd season of collegiate competition Friday when the it travels to Manakto, Minn. to rekindle a long-standing rivalry with intrastate foe Minnesota State University, Mankato. The Beavers enter the series owing a 44-31-13 lead in the all-time series and look to extend a two-game winning streak over the Mavericks at the Alltel Center. Opening faceoff is set for 7:37 p.m. Friday, while the puck will drop on the series finale Saturday at 7:07 p.m.

## THE SERIES

When the Beavers meet the Mavericks Oct. 10-11 it will mark the continuation of one of BSU's most often revisited rivalries. The series got its start Nov. 25, 1974 and has included 88 previous meetings which places it third to only Wisconsin-Superior (129 games) and St. Scholastica (91 games) as BSU most familiar opponent.

The Beavers enter the weekend totting a 44-31-13 record versus the Mavericks all-time but are 15-20-8 when playing MSU on its home ice. Since the teams each made the jump to the major college hockey level in the late 1990s, MSU carries an 11-5-2 record and enters that series having defeated the Beavers in the last two head-to-head match ups. But BSU has won four of the last six meetings and looks to extend a two-game winning streak over MSU on its home ice.

BSU and MSU built a large portion of the series in the NCAA Division II and III ranks as members of the NCHA. The teams even met in the quarterfinals of the NCAA Division II championship with a young Tom Serratore in uniform for the Beavers.

The series has often been noted as a high-scoring affair. BSU has netted six or more goals on 22 occasions, while the teams have combined for 10 or more goals 17 times.

## THE COACH

► Bemidji State's **Tom Serratore** (Bemidji St. '86) is in his eighth season at the helm of the Beavers and has an overall record of 120-102-28 (.536) in 250 games coached. He has guided the Beavers to six consecutive seasons of .500 or better hockey. Serratore's teams have won CHA Regular Season Championships three times in the last five years (2004, 2005 and 2008) and made consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament in 2005 and 2006 after conference tournament titles. He was named CHA Coach of the Year in 2004, 2005 and 2008 and is a three-time finalist for the Spencer Penrose Award (2002-2004-2005).

## THE UNPARALLELED TRADITION

The 2008-09 season represents the 10th at the NCAA Division I level for Bemidji State, and the 53rd year of intercollegiate competition, for a program which has assembled one of the finest traditions in all of American collegiate sports.

- BSU holds 13 NAIA, NCAA Division II and NCAA Division III national titles.
- The Beavers have captured 20 conference titles in 53 seasons of intercollegiate competition.
- BSU won the CHA regular-season championship in 2003-2004 and 2004-2005, becoming the league's first repeat regular-season titlist and is fresh off a 2007-08 crown. BSU has also won CHA Tournament titles in 2005 and 2006.
- BSU has developed five NHL players, six Olympians and 81 All-America honorees.
- BSU has compiled an all-time record of 925-442-81 (.667) in 1,447 games and has the highest all-time winning percentage of the 58 programs which currently comprise NCAA Division I ice hockey.

## GENERAL NOTES

### ICE SHAVINGS

► Bemidji State has posted a 445-304-40 record in road games since the program began in 1947 and is 15-20-8 when those games have come in Mankato, Minn.

► The Mavericks also open their season this weekend.

► The BSU/MSU series got its start Nov. 25, 1974. Since then, the former NCHA foes have met on 88 occasions with 18 coming at the NCAA Division I level. BSU holds a 44-31-13 lead in the all-time series, but MSU enters the weekend after taking a pair of one-goal games from the Beavers a year ago (Dec. 14-15).

► Despite getting shut out on the final game of the series last winter, **Tyler Scofield**, **Matt Read** and **Graham McManamin** each collected two points in the series with Scofield and Read posted a goal and an assist, while McManamin recorded a pair of helpers.

► Travis Winter leads all current BSU players versus MSU netting three goals and two assists in five games played.

► The Beavers are 3-22-2 since 1999 on Olympic-sized ice rinks. Two of those wins have come versus the Mavericks on their home ice.

### BSU FINISHES 17-16-3

Bemidji State wrapped up its 2007-08 campaign, its ninth as a member of the NCAA Division I ranks, with a record of 17-16-3. It marked the sixth consecutive year the Beavers have posted a record of .500 or better.

The Beavers also added their third College Hockey America regular-season title in five years with a record of 13-4-3 in league play.

### OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

Senior forward **Travis Winter** (St. Cloud, Minn.) will captain the Beavers during 2008-09 campaign. Senior defenseman **Cody Bostock** (Salmon Arm, B.C.) and junior forward **Chris McKelvie** (New Brighton, Minn.) will have the "A" on their jerseys designating them as assistant captains.

### SEASON OPENERS

Bemidji State enters this weekend's series versus Minnesota State hoping to continue a long history of success in its opening contest of the season. Entering its 53rd season of intercollegiate competition, BSU has posted an impressive 39-12-2 (.727) mark all-time in season-openers, is unbeaten in 18 of its last 20 lid lifters and since a loss in its 1978-79 opener has gone 24-3-1.

Since making the jump to Division I in 1999, BSU has gone 6-2-1 in season openers, is 4-2-1 (.643) under Serratore and brings a four-game season-opening win streak into Mankato this weekend.

### OT UNBEATEN STREAK AT 10

Bemidji State's 4-3 overtime victory versus Wayne State (Mich.) Feb. 2, 2008 marked the Beavers fourth overtime game of the 2007-08 season and helped BSU to improve to 1-0-3 in overtime games.

BSU is unbeaten (4-0-8) in its last 12 overtime games dating back to a March 11, 2006 victory over Ala.-Huntsville in the CHA Tournament.

### NOTING 1-0 VICTORIES

Bemidji State's 1-0 win at Wayne State on Dec. 1, 2006 was just the third 1-0 win in BSU's 53 years of intercollegiate hockey competition, and the first since the program moved to Division I for the 1999-2000 season.

BSU had not posted a 1-0 win since Jan. 14, 1980, when it defeated St. Cloud State. BSU's first 1-0 win came over St. Scholastica on Feb. 17, 1977.

### BEAVERS PICKED SECOND

Bemidji State was picked to finish second in the 2008-09 CHA Preseason Coaches' Poll. The Beavers came in behind 2008 CHA Tournament Champion and NCAA Tournament participant Niagara. The Purple Eagles garnered nine points and three first place votes to edge BSU for the top spot. Bemidji State received the final first place ballot and totaled seven points. Robert Morris and Alabama-Huntsville rounded out the poll with four points apiece.

### BEAVERS NAMED PRESEASON ALL-CHA

Bemidji State senior defenseman **Cody Bostock** and forwards **Tyler Scofield** and **Matt Read** were named to the 2008 Preseason All-CHA Team. The honor marked the first of its kind for all three BSU players. Bostock and Read enter the season after being named to the All-CHA First Team and Rookie Team last winter while Scofield earned a spot on the CHA All-Tournament Team.

### PLAYERS MAY COME...

Bemidji State welcomes a group of nine new players into the fold this season--eight freshman and a transfer--with five playing forward, three looking for time on the BSU blue line and a goaltender.

**Darcy Findlay, Ben Kinne, Jamie MacQueen, Brent Tamane and Shea Walters** look to earn their way into the BSU lineup at forward. Freshman defenders **Brad Hunt** and **Tyler Jundt** will work their way in with the defenders along with sophomore transfer **Ryan Adams**. Adams transferred to Bemidji State from Wayne State (Mich.) after posting a goal and six assists in 32 games last winter for the Warriors. **Dan Bakala** rounds out the class of newcomers as the only goaltender.

### ...AND PLAYERS MAY GO

BSU lost six seniors to graduation following the 2007-08 season. As a class, **Jake Bluhm, Matt Climie, David Deterding, Blaine Jarvis, Matt Pope and Riley Weselowski** helped BSU to two CHA regular-season crowns, two NCAA Tournament appearances, and two CHA Tournament titles while earning, 17 Academic All-CHA nods, three All-CHA selections, two ESPN the Magazine/CoSIDA Academic All-District awards, a CHA Tournament MVP selection and one was named to the CHA All-Rookie squad.

Individually, Climie leaves BSU after logging his name atop nearly every goaltending category. He finished second in save percentage (.908) and goals-against average (2.45) fifth in saves (2,201) fourth in minutes played (5427) and at the top of the list in career shutouts (12).

Offensively, BSU two of its top 10 Division I era goal scorers in Pope (33) and Jarvis (33) while Weselowski and Deterding accounted for 9-44=53 points from the blue line.

### BEAVER SCORING BY CLASS

The 2007-08 Beavers were saddled with the task of replacing the scoring output of a pair of 100-point scorers and two of the top four scorers in BSU's Division I history in Luke Erickson and Rob Sirianni.

Although the Beavers scored fewer goals per game (2.83) when compared to 2006-07 (2.93), each class pitched in for a relatively balanced scoring effort. The junior class was the most productive of the four netting 17-24-41 points with seven game-winners. The sophomores posted 6-20=26 points, the seniors scored 15 goals while adding 10 assists for 25 points and the freshman came on at the end of the season to contribute 6-12=18 points.

### BSU 18TH IN ALL-TIME WINS

Bemidji State became the 18th program among the 59 current members of NCAA Division I to post its 900th all-time victory when it defeated Ala.-Huntsville, 3-2, on Dec. 15, 2006. BSU's 922 victories currently rank 18th all-time among current members of Division I. Cornell is next ahead of BSU, in 17th all-time with 937 victories. Fifteen Division I programs have posted 1,000 wins, including 2007-08 BSU foes North Dakota (1,239; 7th), Denver (1,196; 8th), Army (1,041; 13th) and Colorado College (1,031; 14th) as of Feb. 18th. Minnesota leads Division I with 1,582 all-time victories, and is the only program in the nation with 1,500 or more all-time wins, while Boston University is second with 1,457 victories.

### BEAVERS' STINGY "D"

The Beavers completed the 2007-08 campaign ranked eighth in the country in goals allowed per game at 2.28. Much of that success should be attributed to BSU's goaltenders and penalty-kill units. **Matt Climie** headlined the crew posting the 12th-best GAA this season at 2.16 while the penalty kill was slotted 12th killing 86.3 percent of opponent power-plays (164-190).

### ONE IS NOT THE MAGIC NUMBER

The Beavers struggled a year ago when playing in games decided by one goal. BSU was 2-10 in one-goal games during the 36-game 2007-08 season. Five of those losses have come to teams hailing from the WCHA and 1-0 and 4-3 losses came at the hands of this weekend's opponent Minnesota State.

## GENERAL NOTES

### THE THIRD TIME IS A CHARM

Last season when BSU netted three or more goals, the team was 14-3-1. In games that the Beavers managed four goals or more, the team is 11-1-0.

### BEAVERS VERSUS THE NATIONALLY-RANKED

Bemidji State's 3-2 victory over then-No. 8 Colorado College on Dec. 29, 2006 was BSU's first victory over a nationally-ranked opponent since a 3-1 win over then-No. 14 Minnesota Duluth on Nov. 14, 2003.

The win at CC also marked the programs first victory over an opponent ranked in the top 10 in the USA Today / USA Hockey Magazine poll since the Beavers made the jump to the NCAA Division I ranks in 1999.

### D-MEN ON THE SCOREBOARDS

Bemidji State's defensive corps recorded a goal and three assists in the CHA Tournament to cap 2007-08, giving BSU defensive players at least one point in 25 of the final 31 games of the season.

During the 2007-08 campaign, BSU defensemen combined for 16-48=63 points (1.56 ppg). BSU's blue-liners accounted for five goals and 13 assists in the team's final 10 games.

### OFFENSIVE DEFENDER

Junior defenseman **Cody Bostock** was a big factor for the Beavers on both ends of the ice in 2007-08. In addition to his duties in BSU's zone, he was an offensive threat. In the final 16 games of the season, Bostock posted four of goals and nine assists. He finished sixth on the team in scoring with 7-12=19 and of his seven goals, four were game-winners putting him in the top spot among league scorers. His 5-9-14 points in CHA play tied for third among CHA defenders.

### POWER-PLAY SHUTOUTS

Bemidji State held North Dakota without a power-play goal on a three of opportunities in its Feb. 23, 2008 contest marking the 21st time in 2007-08 that the Beavers held their opponent scoreless on the power play. BSU posted a record of 14-5-2 in 2007-08 when its penalty kill unit shut out an opponent.

### PENALTY-KILL POWER

Successfully killing 164-of-190 (.863) opponent power-play opportunities during the 2007-08 season, the Beavers' penalty-kill unit was just a fraction of a percentage point from setting a new BSU Division I era mark for efficiency. The current mark of .868 was by the 2004-05 squad when it squashed 192-of-221 opponent opportunities.

### COMBINED EFFICIENCY

In 2007-08, the BSU special teams units combined to rank the Beavers third in the country registering a 55.2-percent success rate. Headlined by the 12th-ranked penalty kill (164-190/.863), BSU's power-play clicked along at a .209 rate (36/172) to rank it ninth.

### MULTIPLE POWER-PLAY GOALS

Bemidji State went 3-for-12 on the man advantage in its Mar. 15, 2008 victory over Wayne State, marking the 10th time in 2007-08 that BSU scored multiple power-play goals in a contest. The Beavers were 8-2-0 in those games.

The Beavers 10 multi power-play goal games matched its 2003-04 output for second on the program's Division I-era list. The Beavers scored multiple power-play goals a Division I-era record 11 times in 2004-05, posting a record of 8-3-0.

Since the team made the jump to the NCAA Division I level in 1999, BSU has posted a record of 47-18-4 when scoring more than one power-play goal in a game.

## BEMIDJI STATE HEAD COACH TOM SERRATORE

### Bemidji State '87 / eighth season at BSU

- ▶ Three-Time CHA Coach of the Year (2004, 2005, 2008)
- ▶ Three-Time Spencer Penrose Award Finalist (2002, 2004, 2005)

Conventional sports wisdom has long contended it is never wise to follow a legend. However, sporting a remarkable laundry-list of achievements after five years as head coach at Bemidji State, it appears Tom Serratore is more than comfortable in the role.

The legacy Serratore was asked to continue upon accepting the role as Bemidji State's seventh head coach in 2001 is one of the finest in all of collegiate athletics. Serratore walks by the trophy case running the length of the John Glas Fieldhouse concourse on his way to practice each day, in full view of the 13 small-college national championship trophies enshrined therein, trophies won by future hockey Hall of Fame member R.H. "Bob" Peters.

Serratore not only had the challenge of inheriting one of the true dynasties in the history of collegiate athletics, he also was called to oversee its growth into a Division I program.

While Serratore will be the first to admit he'll not be able to replicate Peters' achievements, there can be little doubt the program is in the right hands.

BSU finished 4-26-4 in 2000-01, the year before Serratore took control of the program. He led BSU to a 12-18-5 record during his rookie campaign, and has increased BSU's win total each year since. BSU finished 23-13-1 in 2004-05, giving the Beavers a school-record for wins in a Division I season and back-to-back 20-win campaigns for the first time as a Division I program.

Under Serratore's guidance, 23 BSU skaters have earned All-CHA honors, including two-time First-Team All-CHA picks Marty Goulet (2002-03) and Bryce Methven (2003-04), with two Beavers earning CHA Rookie of the Year laurels. BSU has had multiple skaters named First-Team All-CHA each of the last six seasons, including a school-record three first-teamers in 2003.

Academic excellence has been a staple of the BSU program under Serratore. The Beavers had a CHA-record 18 skaters named Academic All-CHA in 2008, and under Serratore's guidance have a league-high 101 Academic All-CHA picks over the last seven years. Niagara is second with 80 selections in the same span. In addition, BSU has had eight CoSIDA Academic All-District V selections under Serratore, including 2005 First-Team Academic All-America selection Peter Jonsson.

Serratore's achievements have not gone unnoticed. He is a three-time CHA Coach of the Year, winning the honor in both 2004, 2005, and 2008 and in seven years as a collegiate head coach he has been named a finalist for the Spencer Penrose Award, given annually to the American Hockey Coaches Association's National Coach of the Year, four times.

Serratore took over the reigns as the seventh head coach at Bemidji State in 2001 after having spent the previous three seasons as the associate head coach for Peters.
