### PLAYER TO WATCH

Although **Matt Read** failed to record a point in the series finale at Niagara Saturday, he has two goals and four assists in the Beavers' last six games and owns a season-long five-game scoring streak. Read leads BSU in scoring and assists with 2-6=8 points.

## THE SERIES

The Bemidji State University men's hockey team is back home this week after opening the 2008-09 season playing eight of its first ten games on the road. The Beavers return to the John Glas Fieldhouse to host Michigan Tech University for the first time ever. The puck will drop at 7:35 p.m. Friday and 7:05 p.m. Saturday.

The match-up pits the 3-7-0 Beavers, who currently hold down the top spot in the College Hockey America (CHA) standings with a 2-2-0 record in league play, versus Michigan Tech, which is 2-9-1 overall and is 10th in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA) with a mark of 1-8-1. While the Beavers have won five of their last eight, including a pair of exhibition wins over Manitoba, The Huskies are 0-6-1 in their last seven outings and seek their first victory since a 4-2 win over Alaska Anchorage Oct. 31.

## THE RIVALRY

Although the Bemidji State and Michigan Tech programs hit the ice this weekend with more than 140 season of ice hockey behind them, combined, the series marks just the third and fourth meetings between the teams. The Huskies got the best of the Beavers January 12-13, 2007 when the teams first met. MTU earned a 4-1 victory in the first game of the series while it needed three third period goals to prevail over the Beavers in the second game of the series, 3-2.

## THE COACH

► Bemidji State's Tom Serratore (Bemidji State '86) is in his eighth season in his current post at BSU and has an overall record of 123-109-28. He has guided the Beavers to six consecutive seasons of .500 or better hockey. Serratore's teams have won CHA Regular Season Championships three times in the last five years (2004, 2005 and 2008) and made consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament in 2005 and 2006 after conference tournament titles. He was named CHA Coach of the Year in 2004, 2005 and 2008.

## THE UNPARALLELED TRADITION

The 2008-09 season represents the 10th at the NCAA Division I level, and the 53rd year of intercollegiate competition, for a BSU program which has assembled one of the finest traditions in all of American collegiate sports.

► BSU holds 13 NAIA, NCAA Division II and NCAA Division III national titles.

► The Beavers have captured 20 conference titles in 53 seasons of intercollegiate competition.

► BSU won the CHA regular-season championship in 2003-2004 and 2004-2005, becoming the league's first repeat regular-season titlist, and is fresh off a 2007-08 crown. BSU has also won CHA Tournament titles in 2005 and 2006.

► BSU has developed five NHL players, six Olympians and 81 All-America honorees.

► BSU has compiled an all-time record of 925-448-81 (.667) in 1,454 games and has the highest all-time winning percentage of the 58 programs which currently comprise NCAA Division I ice hockey.

► In the last five years, not NCAA Division I men's ice hockey team has a better winner percentage in league play than the Beaver's .710 mark versus the CHA.

## GENERAL NOTES

### ICE SHAVINGS

- In their last action, the Beavers rallied for a series split with 2008 CHA Tournament Champion and NCAA Tournament participant Niagara. The Purple Eagles won game one, 3-1, but the Beavers bounced back Saturday to earn a 3-1 victory.
- Since the beginning of the 2005-06, BSU is 8-6-2 when returning from a week off.
- In its last two series, BSU's defense has supplied the Beavers with 2-5=7 of the Beavers' 15 points.
- Matt Francis made his debut last weekend after sitting out the first nine games of the season due to injury. In his first game back, he netted a goal and assisted on another.
- The Bemidji State power-play has yet to get rolling. BSU has converted just 7-of-57 opportunities this year (.123) and has not netted a goal on the man advantage in its last 18 tries. The last BSU power-play goal came in the second period of the Beavers Nov. 7 victory at Ala.-Huntsville.
- The Beavers are 1-1 this year at home and are 480-139-41 all-time on the ice of its current home for a winning percentage of .758. The John S. Glas Fieldhouse is the site of a 57-game winning streak stretching from Dec. 11, 1981 to Dec. 14, 1985
- BSU is 7-5-0 at home versus teams hailing from the WCHA since the beginning of the 2004-05 season.
- Michigan Tech comes into the series looking for its first win since Oct. 31.
- The Huskies are led in scoring by blue liner Drew Dobson who is tied for 29th in the country with nine assists (.75 apg). Jordan Baker paces the team with six goals.
- Jamie Russell is in his sixth season at the helm of the Michigan Tech hockey program. In five-plus seasons, he has directed the Huskies to a 57-121-26 overall record and a 43-99-22 mark in WCHA play. That record includes a 2006-07 campaign in which MTU was 18-17-5, finished sixth in the league standings, made its first appearance in the WCHA Final Five since 1996 and Russell was recognized at the WCHA Co-Coach of the Year.

### BSU FINISHES 17-16-3

Bemidji State wrapped up its 2007-08 campaign, its ninth as a member of the NCAA Division I ranks, with a record of 17-16-3. It marked the sixth consecutive year the Beavers have posted a record of .500 or better.

The Beavers also added their third College Hockey America regular-season title in five years with a record of 13-4-3 in league play.

### OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

Senior forward **Travis Winter** (St. Cloud, Minn.) will captain the Beavers during 2008-09 campaign. Senior defenseman **Cody Bostock** (Salmon Arm, B.C.) and junior forward **Chris McKelvie** (New Brighton, Minn.) will have the "A" on their jerseys designating them as assistant captains.

### OT UNBEATEN STREAK AT 12

Bemidji State's 2-1 overtime victory at Ala.-Huntsville Nov. 8, 2008 marked the Beavers' first overtime game of the 2008-09 season and helped BSU to improve to 1-0-1 in overtime games this year.

BSU is unbeaten (5-0-8) in its last 12 overtime games dating back to a March 11, 2006 victory over Ala.-Huntsville in the CHA Tournament.

### NOTING 1-0 VICTORIES

Bemidji State's 1-0 win at Wayne State on Dec. 1, 2006 was just the third 1-0 win in BSU's 53 years of intercollegiate hockey competition, and the first since the program moved to Division I for the 1999-2000 season.

BSU had not posted a 1-0 win since Jan. 14, 1980, when it defeated St. Cloud State. BSU's first 1-0 win came over St. Scholastica on Feb. 17, 1977.

### BEAVERS PICKED SECOND

Bemidji State was picked to finish second in the 2008-09 CHA Preseason Coaches' Poll. The Beavers came in behind 2008 CHA Tournament Champion and NCAA Tournament participant Niagara. The Purple Eagles garnered nine points and three first place votes to edge BSU for the top spot. Bemidji State received the final first place ballot and totaled seven points. Robert Morris and Alabama-Huntsville rounded out the poll with four points apiece.

### BEAVERS NAMED PRESEASON ALL-CHA

Bemidji State senior defenseman **Cody Bostock** and forwards **Tyler Scofield** and **Matt Read** were named to the 2008 Preseason All-CHA Team. The honor marked the first of its kind for all three BSU players. Bostock and Read enter the season after being named

to the All-CHA First Team and Rookie Team last winter while Scofield earned a spot on the CHA All-Tournament Team.

### PLAYERS MAY COME...

Bemidji State welcomes a group of nine new players into the fold this season--eight freshman and a transfer--with five playing forward, three looking for time on the BSU blue line and a goaltender.

**Darcy Findlay, Ben Kinne, Jamie MacQueen, Brent Tamane** and **Shea Walters** look to earn their way into the BSU lineup at forward. Freshman defenders **Brad Hunt** and **Tyler Jundt** will work their way in with the defenders along with sophomore transfer **Ryan Adams**. Adams transferred to Bemidji State from Wayne State (Mich.) after posting a goal and six assists in 32 games last winter for the Warriors. **Dan Bakala** rounds out the class of newcomers as the only goaltender.

### ...AND PLAYERS MAY GO

BSU lost six seniors to graduation following the 2007-08 season. As a class, **Jake Bluhm, Matt Climie, David Deterding, Blaine Jarvis, Matt Pope** and **Riley Weselowski** helped BSU to two CHA regular-season crowns, two NCAA Tournament appearances, and two CHA Tournament titles while earning, 17 Academic All-CHA nods, three All-CHA selections, two ESPN the Magazine/CoSIDA Academic All-District awards, a CHA Tournament MVP selection and one was named to the CHA All-Rookie squad.

Individually, Climie leaves BSU after logging his name atop nearly every goaltending category. He finished second in save percentage (.908) and goals-against average (2.45) fifth in saves (2,201) fourth in minutes played (5427) and at the top of the list in career shutouts (12).

Offensively, BSU two of its top 10 Division I era goal scorers in Pope (33) and Jarvis (33) while Weselowski and Deterding accounted for 9-44=53 points from the blue line.

### BEAVER SCORING BY CLASS

As could be expected from any team, the Beavers' scoring output has been headlined by its upper classmen...but not by much. The seniors lead the charge with 10-8=18 points, but ironically it is the freshman class that has given BSU a boost in scoring totalling 6-7=13 points to currently sit in second.

In 2007-08, although scored fewer goals per game (2.83) when compared to 2006-07 (2.93), each class pitched in for a relatively balanced scoring effort. The junior class was the most productive of the four netting 17-24-41 points with seven game-winners. The sophomores posted 6-20=26 points, the seniors scored 15 goals while adding 10 assists for 25 points and the freshman came on at the end of the season to contribute 6-12=18 points.

### BSU 18TH IN ALL-TIME WINS

Bemidji State became the 18th program among the 58 current members of NCAA Division I to post its 900th all-time victory when it defeated Ala.-Huntsville, 3-2, on Dec. 15, 2006. BSU's 923 victories currently rank 18th all-time among current members of Division I. Cornell is next ahead of BSU, in 17th all-time with 945 victories. Fourteen Division I programs have posted 1,000 wins, including 2008-09 BSU foes North Dakota (1,253; 7th), Michigan Tech (1,084; 10th) and the possible match up with Army (1,050; 13th) through Nov. 18, 2008. Minnesota leads Division I with 1,582 all-time victories, and is the only program in the nation with 1,500 or more all-time wins, while Boston College is second with 1,357 victories.

2008-09 BSU has managed three or more goals on just two occasions and is 1-1, while it is 1-0 in games in which it scores four or more.

## BEAVERS VERSUS THE NATIONALLY-RANKED

Bemidji State's 4-2 victory over then-No. 15 St. Cloud State Oct. 24, 2008 was its first victory over a nationally-ranked opponent since a 3-2 win over No. 8 Colorado College on Dec. 29, 2006.

The win at CC also marked the programs first victory over an opponent ranked in the top 10 in the USA Today / USA Hockey Magazine poll since the Beavers made the jump to the NCAA Division I ranks in 1999.

## D-MEN ON THE SCOREBOARDS

Bemidji State's defensive corps recorded three assists in the series versus Niagara, giving BSU defensive players at least one point in 33 of the last 41 games--the last six games consecutively.

During the 2007-08 campaign, BSU defensemen combined for 16-48=63 points (1.56 ppg). BSU's blue liners accounted for five goals and 13 assists in the team's final 10 games.

## OFFENSIVE DEFENDER

Freshman defenseman **Brad Hunt** has been a big factor for the Beavers on both ends of the ice in 2008-09. In addition to his duties in BSU's defensive zone, he has become offensive threat. Through ten games, he currently leads all blue liners and ranks third on the team in scoring with 2-3=5 points.

## GET MARINO THE PUCK

This season senior forward **Brandon Marino** is two-for-two. He has two goals on the season and each has stood as the difference-maker in a BSU's victory.

## NO SHORTIES ALLOWED

Stretching back to last year, the Beavers have gone 126 power-play opportunities without giving up a short-handed marker. The last shortie that the Beavers allowed was Feb. 15, 2008 in a 4-1 loss to Robert Morris.

## PENALTY-KILL POWER

Successfully killing 164-of-190 (.863) opponent power-play opportunities during the 2007-08 season, the Beavers' penalty-kill unit was just a fraction of a percentage point from setting a new BSU Division I era mark for efficiency. The current mark of .868 was by the 2004-05 squad when it squashed 192-of-221 opponent opportunities. In 2008-09, BSU has yet to live up to the bar set a year ago. Despite allowing just two power-play goals in the team's last four outings, BSU has killed just 57-of-71 opponent power-play opportunities (.817).

## MULTIPLE POWER-PLAY GOALS

Bemidji State went 2-for-7 on the man advantage Oct. 25 versus St. Cloud State, marking the Beavers' third multi power-play goal games of 2008-09. In 2007-08, the Beavers posted 10 multi-power-play goal games and were 8-2-0 in those games.

BSU's 10 multi power-play goal games matched its 2003-04 output for second on the program's Division I-era list. The Beavers scored multiple power-play goals a Division I-era record 11 times in 2004-05, posting a record of 8-3-0.

Since the team made the jump to the NCAA Division I level in 1999, BSU has posted a record of 48-19-4 in multi power-play goal games.

## ROAD WARRIORS?

With 10 of their 18 CHA contests coming on the road in 2008-09, Bemidji State is going to have to own opponents ice if they plan to defend their regular-season crown. The Beavers are 2-6-0 this year on the road with a 2-2-0 mark coming in CHA road contests.

## BEMIDJI STATE HEAD COACH TOM SERRATORE

### Bemidji State '87 / eighth season at BSU

- ▶ Three-Time CHA Coach of the Year (2004, 2005, 2008)
- ▶ Three-Time Spencer Penrose Award Finalist (2002, 2004, 2005)

Conventional sports wisdom has long contended it is never wise to follow a legend. However, sporting a remarkable laundry-list of achievements after seven years as head coach at Bemidji State, it appears Tom Serratore is more than comfortable in the role.

The legacy Serratore was asked to continue upon accepting the role as Bemidji State's seventh head coach in 2001 is one of the finest in all of collegiate athletics. Serratore walks by the trophy case running the length of the John Glas Fieldhouse concourse on his way to practice each day, in full view of the 13 small-college national championship trophies enshrined therein, trophies won by future hockey Hall of Fame member R.H. "Bob" Peters.

Serratore not only had the challenge of inheriting one of the true dynasties in the history of collegiate athletics, he also was called to oversee its growth into a Division I program.

While Serratore will be the first to admit he'll not be able to replicate Peters' achievements, there can be little doubt the program is in the right hands.

BSU finished 4-26-4 in 2000-01, the year before Serratore took control of the program. He led BSU to a 12-18-5 record during his rookie campaign, and has increased BSU's win total each year since. BSU finished 23-13-1 in 2004-05, giving the Beavers a school-record for wins in a Division I season and back-to-back 20-win campaigns for the first time as a Division I program.

Under Serratore's guidance, 23 BSU skaters have earned All-CHA honors, including two-time First-Team All-CHA picks Marty Goulet (2002-03), Bryce Methven (2003-04), Matt Climie (2006-07), Travis Winter (2006-07 and Cody Bostock (2007-08) with three Beavers earning CHA Rookie of the Year laurels. BSU has had multiple skaters named First-Team All-CHA six of the last seven seasons, including a school-record three first-teamers in 2003.

Academic excellence has been a staple of the BSU program under Serratore. The Beavers had a CHA-record 18 skaters named Academic All-CHA in 2008, and under Serratore's guidance have a league-high 101 Academic All-CHA picks over the last seven years. Niagara is second with 80 selections in the same span. In addition, BSU has had eight CoSIDA Academic All-District V selections under Serratore, including 2005 First-Team Academic All-America selection Peter Jonsson.

Serratore's achievements have not gone unnoticed. He is a three-time CHA Coach of the Year, winning the honor in both 2004, 2005, and 2008 and in seven years as a collegiate head coach he has been named a finalist for the Spencer Penrose Award, given annually to the American Hockey Coaches Association's National Coach of the Year, four times.

Serratore took over the reigns as the seventh head coach at Bemidji State in 2001 after having spent the previous three seasons as the associate head coach for Peters.
