



## Post-Game Notes

Bemidji State (10-8-3 / 5-3-1 CHA) 3, Wayne State (4-12-3 / 1-4-2 CHA) 3

### Series Notes

- ▶ Bemidji State moves to 16-6-4 in 26 all-time meetings with Wayne St. ...BSU is unbeaten in 10 of 11 meetings since Dec. 5, 2003.
- ▶ BSU moves to 19-2-2 against Wayne St. in Bemidji. ...BSU extends its unbeaten streak against Wayne State in Bemidji to seven consecutive games. WSU has not won in Bemidji since Feb. 23, 2002.
- ▶ BSU extends its unbeaten streak in the series to five consecutive games dating back to a 2-0 BSU win on Feb. 4, 2005. ...the five-game unbeaten streak is tied for BSU's longest in the series, matching a five-game win streak from Dec. 15, 2003 to Nov. 22, 2004. ...the five-game unbeaten streak is BSU's longest active streak against any College Hockey America opponent.

### BSU Head Coach Tom Serratore

- ▶ Serratore sees his career record move to 79-66-20 in 165 games.
- ▶ Sees his record at BSU move to 79-66-20 in 165 games.
- ▶ Moves to 55-23-10 in 88 regular-season games against CHA foes.
- ▶ Moves his head-to-head record with Wayne St. to 12-5-2.

### Team Notes

- ▶ Bemidji State sees its all-time record move to 882-406-73 (.675) in 1,361 intercollegiate games and its 50th season of competition.
- ▶ BSU saw its all-time Division I-era record move to 96-112-25 (.466) in 233 games and its seventh season at the Division I level.
- ▶ Coupled with a 2-1 loss at Robert Morris on Jan. 7, Bemidji State is winless in consecutive games against CHA foes for the first time in nearly three years. ...BSU's last regular-season winless streak in CHA play came in an 0-3-1 skid from Feb. 1-21, 2003.
- ▶ Bemidji State played its third overtime game this season, with all three coming in the team's last five starts. ...BSU moves to 0-1-3 in overtime this season and 10-13-25 in its Division I era.
- ▶ Bemidji State remains winless in its last five games played on Friday the 13th (0-4-1) dating back to 1995 and moves to 13-6-2 all-time on Friday the 13th games. ...BSU is 0-1-1 on Friday the 13th in its Division I era.
- ▶ Bemidji State scored the game's first goal at 19:51 of the first period... ...scored first for just the 7th time in last 15 games. ...BSU moves to 8-1-2 this year when scoring first
- ▶ Wayne State had 15 shots on goal in the first period, its most shots in a period against BSU since a 17-shot second period on Nov. 23, 2004.
- ▶ Riley Weselowski's second-period short-handed goal was the first by a BSU player since Lou Garrigan, also against Wayne State, on Nov. 11. ...first short-handed goal by BSU in a span of 845:33 of game time.
- ▶ Wayne State's special-teams struggles against BSU continued. The Warriors went 0-for-7 on the power play tonight, and now... ...since the start of the 2001-02 season are 7-for-104 against BSU (.067). ...have failed on 38 consecutive power-play chances against BSU dating back to Nov. 23, 2004.
- ▶ BSU extended its streak of consecutive games with a goal scored to 54 dating back to Nov. 6, 2004; it is the second-longest streak in BSU's Division I era, trailing a 60-game streak from Dec. 13, 2002 to Oct. 23, 2004.

...10:23/2nd: 5th assist this season; 11th of his career; 22nd career point.
- ▶ **D Cody Bostock (Fr.; Salmon Arm, British Columbia)**  
...4:36/2nd: 3rd assist this season; 3rd of career; 5th career point.
- ▶ **G Matt Climie (So.; Leduc, Alberta)**  
...Made his 28th career start and his 32nd career appearance in net. ...third career start against Wayne State. ...33 saves in the tie; career record moves to 16-10-3. ...in each of Climie's three career ties, BSU has blown third-period leads of at least two goals. ...Wayne State goal at 17:02/2nd snapped Climie's streak of consecutive shutout minutes in all games at 104:33; against CHA opponents at 103:45; and against Wayne State at 85:18. ...prior to tonight, Climie had allowed just one goal to Wayne State in 137:47 of ice time.

...19:51/1st: 4th goal this season; 10th of his career; 32nd career point. ...first career first goal.
- ▶ **F Ryan Miller (Jr.; Fergus Falls, Minn.)**  
...19:51/1st: 6th assist this season; 21st of his career; 35th career point. ...10:23/2nd: 6th goal this season; 15th of his career; 36th career point. ...4th multi-point game this season; 8th of his career. ...moves sole possession of 19th place on BSU Division I-era career scoring list (15-21=36).
- ▶ **F Matt Pope (So.; Langley, British Columbia)**  
...4:36/2nd: 6th assist this season; 13th of his career; 23rd career point.
