POWER TO WINTER

Junior forward Travis Winter ▶

If junior forward **Travis Winter's** previous outings versus Minnesota State is any indication of what can be expected of him this weekend, look for big things. In three career games versus the Mavericks, the junior has rolled up three goals, including a short-handed marker, and two assists for five total points. He enters the weekend looking to build upon a four-game scoring streak.



Quick Hitters

- ▶ Bemidji State is 471-135-40 all-time in the John Glas Fieldhouse and is 29-11-5 when those games have come against Minnesota State.
- ▶ The Mavericks enter the non-conference series 5-6-3 overall and are coming off back-to-back three-point weekends hosting nationally-ranked Minnesota Duluth and Wisconsin.
- ▶ The BSU/MSU series got its start Nov. 25, 1974. Since then the long-time former NCHA foes have met on 86 occasions with 16 coming at the NCAA Division I level. BSU holds a 44-29-13 lead in the all-time series and rides a four-game winning streak over the Mustangs into the weekend.
- ▶ BSU forward **Travis Winter** has accumulated 3-2=5 points in just three career games versus the Mavericks.
- ▶ Senior goaltender Matt Climie looks to extend a four-game unbeaten streak this weekend. He currently ranks fourth in the country in GAA (1.44), seventh in win percentage (.727) and ninth in save percentage (.937). The senior is 2-0-0 in his career when facing MSU.
- ▶ Climie remains one win from equaling Grady Hunt's BSU Division I era victories mark of 39.
- ▶ BSU head coach Tom Serratore and MSU head coach Troy Jutting were teammates at MSU in the during the 1983-84 and 1984-85 seasons. Serratore netted 31-28=59 points before transferring to BSU for the 1984-85 season.
- ▶ BSU Graduate assistant coach Ryan McKelvie also has ties to the MSU men's hockey program. A 2006 graduate of MSU, McKelvie played four seasons for the Mustangs. The three-time captain recorded 9-30=39 points and was selected for MSU's Best Hustle award at the conclusion of the 2003-04 season and the Don Brose Leadership award in 2005-06.

The Coaches

- ▶ Bemidji State's **Tom Serratore** (Bemidji St. '86) is in his seventh season with the Beavers and has an overall record of 111-92-27 (.541) in 230 games coached. He has guided the Beavers to five consecutive seasons of .500 or better hockey. Serratore's teams won back-to-back regular season CHA championships in 2004 and 2005 and made consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament in 2005 and 2006 after conference tournament titles. He was the 2004 and 2005 CHA Coach of the Year and is a three-time finalist for the Spencer Penrose Award (2002-2004-2005).
- ▶ **Troy Jutting** (Minnesota State '87) is in his eighth season piloting the Minnesota State men's hockey program, taking reigns of the Mavericks after 10 seasons as an assistant. He has directed MSU to a 113-135-37 overall record and a 2003 trip to the NCAA Tournament. After the 2002-03 campaign Jutting was selected as both the WCHA's and USA Hockey's Coach of the Year. Jutting has also been active in USA Hockey serving as the head coach of its 2003 U-18 squad that earned a goal medal in the 2003 World Junior Championships.

Tradition Never Graduates

- The 2007-08 season represents the ninth at the NCAA Division I level for Bemidji State, and the 52nd year of intercollegiate competition, for a program which has assembled one of the finest traditions in all of American collegiate sports.
- ▶ BSU holds 13 NAIA, NCAA Division II and NCAA Division III national titles.
 - ▶ Entering the 2007-08 season, the Beavers have captured 19 conference titles in 51 seasons of intercollegiate competition.
 - ▶ BSU won the CHA regular-season championship in 2003-2004 and 2004-2005, becoming the league's first repeat regular-season titleist, and won CHA Tournament crowns in 2005 and 2006.
 - ▶ BSU has developed four NHL players, five Olympians and 81 All-America honorees.
 - ▶ BSU has compiled an all-time record of 908-430-78 (.670) in 1,416 games and has the highest all-time winning percentage of the 59 programs which currently comprise NCAA Division I ice hockey.

College Hockey America Update

BSU at 68.5% vs CHA since 2002

Since the beginning of the 2002-03 season, Bemidji State has posted far and away College Hockey America's best record against league opponents. Over the last six seasons, BSU has a 69-28-13 record in regular-season CHA play, a winning percentage of .686.

In their last 96 regular-season games against league opponents dating back to Feb. 22, 2003, the Beavers have posted a record of 63-22-11 against CHA foes - winning at a .714 clip.

Factor in the CHA Tournament, and BSU has gone 70-24-11 (.719) in its last 105 starts against College Hockey America opponents.

BSU 4th in Conf. Win Pct Since '02

Since the start of the 2002-03 season, Bemidji State has posted a 69-28-13 record in regular-season College Hockey America games, a .686 winning percentage.

That percentage is fourth-highest among the nation's current 59 NCAA Division I programs in conference-only games since the start of the 2002-03 season. Only Cornell, which has posted a record of 78-25-13 (.728) in the ECAC Hockey League; Michigan (101-38-13 in the CCHA) and Boston College (86-32-19 (.697) in Hockey East); have been better against their respective conferences than BSU has been against CHA.

Cornell and Michigan are the nation's only programs which have won at least 70 percent of their conference games since the start of the 2002-03 season.

Beavers swept at home

When the Beavers lost a pair of games to Merrimack at home Nov. 19-20, it was a first for the BSU hockey program under Tom Serratore. Since Serratore took the helm of the BSU program before the 2001-02 season, the Beavers had never been swept at home.

BSU was last swept at the Glass by North Dakota Mar. 2-3 2001.

Beavers Picked Third

With just two points separating first place from third, CHA coaches tabbed BSU behind 2006-07 regular-season champion Niagara University and 2007 CHA Tournament Championship game participant Robert Morris University with 12 points and one first-place vote. With coaches unable to vote for their own teams, BSU picked up one of four possible first-place votes and garnered 12 total points in the balloting.

Captain My Captain

Senior defenseman David Deterding (Alexandria, Minn.) will serve as Bemidji State's team captain again for 2007-08. Senior Jake Bluhm (Red Wing, Minn.) and junior Travis Winter (St. Cloud, Minn.) will serve as assistant captains.

We're goin' streakin'

BSU junior forward Travis Winter enters the weekend after netting points in each game of the Beavers' last four games for a total of 1-4=5 points during the stretch. Goaltender Matt Climie rides a four-game unbeaten streak into the series versus the Mavericks after posting a pair of wins over

Ala.-Huntsville last weekend. On special teams, BSU has not allowed power-play goal in the last 10 periods, holding opponents to 0-for-22 on the man advantage during the streak.

CHA Unbeaten Streak Snapped at RMU

Bemidji State's Feb. 10, 2007 loss at Robert Morris snapped its school-record unbeaten streak over College Hockey America opponents at 11, a streak which began Nov. 11, 2006 with a 3-0 shut-out of Robert Morris.

That 11-game unbeaten streak in CHA play was the longest in BSU history. BSU had previously assembled nine-game unbeaten streaks against CHA on three previous occasions: from Nov. 30, 2001 to Feb. 9, 2002 (6-0-3); from Feb. 22, 2003 to Dec. 6, 2003 (8-0-1); and from Jan. 10, 2004 to Feb. 28, 2004 (8-0-1).

The second of three BSU's nine-game unbeaten streaks against CHA foes also includes a school-record seven consecutive wins in league play from March 1, 2003 to Dec. 6, 2003. BSU has also assembled two five-game winning streaks over CHA opponents.

BSU Suffers Rare CHA Series Sweep

Bemidji State 4-2 and 4-1 losses at Robert Morris, Feb. 9-10, 2007, not only delivered the Colonials their first-ever two-game weekend series sweep of the Beavers, but saw BSU suffer just its seventh sweep in a CHA weekend series under head coach Tom Serratore. In fact, since the beginning of the 2003-04 season, BSU has been swept just three times in CHA play - the Feb. 9-10 sweep at the hands of Robert Morris; a Feb. 24-25, 2006 sweep at Niagara; and a Feb. 3-4, 2006 sweep at Huntsville.

BSU Secures 4th Straight Top 2 Finish

Bemidji State finished 9-6-5 against College Hockey America in 2006-07, securing a fourth consecutive top two finish in the CHA regular-season race.

BSU won the CHA regular-season crown in both 2004 and 2005, establishing a league single-season record with 16 conference victories in both seasons, and tied for second with Ala.-Huntsville after a 12-win campaign in 2005-06.

In total, BSU has finished first or second in the final CHA regular-season standings five times in the eight-year history of the conference, and has finished lower than third just once - in 2000-01.

CHA Schedule for 2007-08

With College Hockey America reduced to five members for 2006-07, the league took on an unusual unbalanced schedule in an effort to retain its traditional 20-game slate of conference games and will maintain the same schedule for the 2007-08 campaign.

Each team in the conference will continue to play its traditional four-game round robin with two home games and two road games against each of CHA's other four members. However, each CHA program will play two additional series - one at home and one on the road - against two opponents.

Bemidji State will play its traditional four-game season series against Niagara and Robert Morris again in 2007-08, while tackling Wayne State and Ala.-Huntsville six times each. Eight of BSU's nine CHA wins in 2006-07 came against its two overload

partners - four wins each against Huntsville and Wayne State.

Beavers Finish 14-14-5

Bemidji State wrapped up its 2006-07 campaign, its eighth as a member of NCAA Division I, with a record of 14-14-5. It marked the fifth consecutive season the Beavers finished with a record of .500 or better.

BSU posted a record of 10-4-3 in its first 17 games, the best 17-game start in the program's Division I era, but a 4-1 loss at Michigan Tech on Jan. 12, 2007 opened a stretch which saw the Beavers go just 2-9-2 in their last 13 games.

OT Unbeaten Streak at 10

Bemidji State's 2-2 draw at Niagara on Dec. 1st was BSU's second overtime game of the 2007-08 campaign, and the draw helped the Beavers go undefeated (0-0-2) in overtime games this season.

BSU is unbeaten (3-0-7) in its last 10 overtime games dating back to a March 11, 2006 victory over Ala.-Huntsville in the CHA Tournament.

With five ties in 2006-07, BSU equalled a mark for second-most in its Division I era and the most since a school-record record eight draws in 2002-03.

Scoring Streak at 49

Bemidji State's 2-0 victory to wrap up the series with Ala.-Huntsville extended the Beavers' streak of consecutive games with at least one goal scored to 49, dating back to its 2006-07 season opener at Maine.

The 49-game scoring streak is the third-longest in BSU's Division I era, and comes immediately on the heels of a Division I-era record 67-game scoring streak which was snapped in BSU's shutout loss to Wisconsin in the first round of the 2006 NCAA Tournament.

In total, BSU has scored in 116 of its last 117 games and in 176 of its last 178 dating back to Dec. 13, 2002.

BSU versus the Nationally Ranked

Bemidji State's 3-2 win at then-No. 8 Colorado College on Dec. 29, 2006 was BSU's first victory over a nationally-ranked opponent since a 3-1 win at then-No. 14 Minnesota Duluth on Nov. 14, 2003.

That win at Colorado College also marked the program's first victory over an opponent ranked in the Top 10 of the USA Today / USA Hockey Magazine poll since the Beavers made the jump to Division I in 1999.

Serratore Posts 100th Career Win

Bemidji State head coach Tom Serratore posted his 100th career win with a 3-2 defeat of Wayne State (Mich.) on Jan. 5. He is now 109-95-27 and is only the second coach in BSU history to reach 100 career wins. Serratore remains a mere 593 wins from BSU career victories leader R.H. "Bob" Peters, who went 702-293-49 at BSU from 1964-2001.

Two Beavers Named Preseason All-CHA

BSU senior goaltender Matt Climie and junior forward Travis Winter represented two of the seven CHA student-athletes named to the 2007-08 Preseason All-CHA squad. The honor was the first of its kind for Winter, a 2007 All-Conference

First Teamer, while it marked the second preseason billing for Climie, also a First Team selection a year ago, as he was named the CHA Preseason Player of the Year prior to the 2005-06 season.

Dalton Selected No. 1 among newcomer

Before BSU freshman goaltender Matt Dalton logged an official minute between the pipes for the Beavers' men's ice hockey team, he had already turned some heads. Inside College Hockey included Dalton as its top incoming goaltender in its annual recruiting rankings.

Dalton comes to BSU from the United State Hockey League's Des Moines Buccaneers. While in Des Moines he led the USHL in minutes played (3029:39) and shutouts (five) while sharing the league lead for wins with 27. His play earned him a spot on the 2007 USHL All-Star Team roster as well as Des Moines Buccaneer Most Valuable Player and Community Service awards.

Prior to his stint in Iowa, Dalton posted North American Hockey League highs in Goals Against Average (1.63) and save percentage (.940) for the Bozeman Ice Dogs. He posted 33 victories with a league-leading nine shutouts and paced the Ice Dogs to a NAHL regular-season championship. His stellar play earned him First-Team All-NAHL accolades and the league's MVP award.

The BSU freshman was one of two student-athletes hailed from a College Hockey America member institution. He is joined by University of Alabama-Huntsville goaltender Cameron Talbot who ranked seventh on this years list.

Purple is his color

Of the 28 players on the 2007-08 BSU men's hockey roster, no current player has enjoyed more success versus Minnesota State than Travis Winter. In just three games versus MSU, the junior forward has piled up 3-2=5 points. Those three goals have come on just five shots on net. In all, he has a +5 plus/minus rating versus the Mavericks.

BSU- NCAA's Winningest Program

Based on overall winning percentage, Bemidji State is the winningest program in college hockey, as it has a higher all-time winning percentage than any of the 59 current members of Division I.

The Beavers have an all-time winning percentage of .668, giving them a significant cushion over second-place Boston University (.655).

BSU is one of only 14 programs in the nation with all-time winning percentages of .600 or better.

BSU in the Polls

Bemidji State received nine points and would have finished 24th in the country if the USCHO/CSTV week 10 poll was extended while it was shut out of both the USA Today/American Hockey Magazine and USCHO/CSTV rankings this week.

In 2006-07, BSU reached a season-high No. 16 in the Jan. 8, 2007 release of the USCHO.com ballot and climbed as high as No. 17 in the USAToday/USA Hockey Magazine poll, also

Bemidji State vs. Minnesota State

When the Mavericks come to town for the Dec. 14-15 non-conference series, it will mark a continuation to one of BSU's most-often revisited rivalry. A rivalry that stretches back to Nov. 25, 1974 and includes 86 previous meetings ranks MSU third behind only series with Wisconsin-Superior (129 gms) and St. Scholastica (91) as BSU most familiar opponents.

BSU enters the weekend toting a 44-29-13 lead in the rivalry and is 29-9-5 at home versus MSU. Since the teams made the jump to major college hockey in the last 1990s, it is MSU that carries a lead in the series, 9-5-2, but BSU comes into Friday's contest lookin to extend a four-game winning streak over the Mavericks dating back to an Oct.

14, 2005, 4-3 victory.

BSU and MSU built a large portion of its series in NCAA Division II and D-III ranks as members of the NCHA. The teams even met in the quarterfinals of the NCAA Division II championship in March of 1985 with a young Tom Serratore in uniform for the Beavers.

A series that has often been noted as a high-scoring affair, BSU has netted six or more goals on 22 occasions while the teams have combined for 10 or more 17 times in the series.

BSU 18th All-Time with 914 Wins

Bemidji State became the 18th program among the 59 current members of NCAA Division I to post its 900th all-time victory when it defeated Ala.-Huntsville, 3-2, on Dec. 15, 2006. **BSU's 914 victories currently rank 18th all-time among current members of Division I.** Cornell is next ahead of BSU, in 17th all-time with 927 victories. Fifteen Division I programs have posted 1,000 wins, including 2007-08 BSU foes North Dakota (1,228; 7th), Denver (1,187; 8th), Army (1,033; 13th) and Colorado College (1,019; 14th) as of Dec. 11th.

Minnesota leads Division I with 1,579 all-time victories, and is the only program in the nation with 1,500 or more all-time wins, while Boston University is second with 1,449 victories.

Beaver Scoring by Class

The 2007-08 Beavers were saddled with the task of replacing the scoring output of a pair of 100-point scorers and two of the top four scorers in BSU Division I history in Luke Erickson and Rob Sirianni. This season each of BSU's four classes have stepped up to balance out BSU's scoring.

Although the Beavers are scoring fewer goals per game in 2007-08 (2.37) when compared to 2006-07 (2.93), the scoring has been balanced. The Beaver juniors currently lead the race totalling 14-19-33 points with six game-winners. The sophomores surpassed the seniors last weekend netting 2-4=6 point set total 5-19-24 points for the year while the seniors are close on their heels with 14-9-23 points.

After a bit of a slow start, the freshman class has begun to come on in the last few weeks currently sitting fourth with 5-11-16 points with 10 of those 16 coming in the eight games since Nov. 9th.

Noting 1-0 Victories

Bemidji State's 1-0 win at Wayne State on Dec. 1, 2006 was just the third 1-0 win in BSU's 52 years of intercollegiate hockey competition, and the first since the program moved to Division I for the 1999-2000 season.

BSU had not posted a 1-0 win since Jan. 14, 1980, when it defeated St. Cloud State. BSU's first 1-0 win came over St. Scholastica on Feb. 17, 1977.

Shot-happy Beavers

Through 16 games of the 2007-08 season, the Bemidji State men's hockey team has yet to be out shot in a single contest. The closest any team has come is when Niagara and Alabama-Huntsville have each matched BSU's shot total in a game this season. To this point in the season, the Beavers hold a 507-360 (+147) advantage in shots taken.

Read setting the pace for rookies

BSU freshman Matt Read has shown that he is adjusting to the NCAA D-I level quite well as of late. In the Beavers' last eight games, the newcomer has netted four goals and added five assists. The Ilderton, Ontario native currently leads all CHA newcomers and is tied for the league among all scorers with 4-5=9 points in league play.

Players May Come...

Bemidji State welcomes a group of nine new players into the fold - eight freshmen and one transfer with six playing forward, two looking for a home on the blue line along with a goalie.

Freshmen forwards Matt Read, Ryan Cramer, Ian Lowe, Jamie Ruff and Emil Billberg are looking to earn their way into the BSU lineup, while the sixth forward in the mix is junior transfer Matt Francis. He is in his second season with the Beavers after sitting out and practicing with the team in 2006-07 after transferring from St. Cloud State.

Tyler Pederson and Dan MacIntyre comprise the duo of freshman defensemen. MacIntyre will be out for most of the remaining games on the BSU 2007-08 schedule due to a collar bone break after just three games played.

The final addition is Matt Dalton. The goaltender comes into the 2007-08 campaign after a stellar junior career. Prior to the start of this season, he was named by Inside College Hockey Magazine as the top-rated incoming goaltender.

...and Players May Go

Bemidji State lost seven players from its 2006-07 roster, five forwards, a defender and a goaltender with the void being felt heavily in the scoring column.

Last year's captain, Luke Erickson, left the school as BSU's Division I-era scoring leader with 122 points. He posted 52 career goals to sit second on BSU's Division goals scored list while he shares the top assists spot with BSU great Andrew Murray netting 69 during his four-year career. In addition to Erickson's 122 career points, the Beavers also lost the services of Rob Sirianni who recorded 101 career points to slide into fourth on the school's all-time scoring list. Ryan Miller also leaves due to graduation taking with him 67 career points. Garrett Roth and Shane Holman also leave after becoming regulars on the BSU attack.

On defense, BSU seeks to replace Nathan Schwartzbauer. Although Duce was not an offensive threat, his 6-2 frame was a force to be reckoned with on the blue line.

In the net, Layne Sedevie leaves BSU after posting 29-21-4 career record. Although he wasn't vital to the Beavers in 2006-07, sitting out the majority of the season due to injury, he posted a 2.88 GAA and .899 save percentage in 3,022 minute sin net for BSU over his career.

Plus-Minus Notes

While it is considered an unofficial statistic at Bemidji State due to incomplete records during BSU's first few years of Division I competition, several current BSU players are faring well on the program's Division I-era career list for plus-minus rating. Forward Jake Bluhm is currently in fourth at +21.

CHA Players of the Week

December 10th, Bemidji State swept the CHA weekly Player of the Week awards for second time this season and just the fourth time in since the team became a member of the CHA for the 1999-2000 campaign. Travis Winter eared the league's top offensive award for 1-2=3 points versus UAH including a helper on the game-winner Friday and netting his third game-winner of the season on Saturday. David Deterding was selected as the Defensive Player of the Week as he captained a defensive unit that allowed just 20 shots on net and held the Chargers to 0-11 on the power-play in the series while Matt Read earned his third Rookie of the Week honor of the season after posting a three-point weekend (1-2=3).

Through nine weeks of the season, BSU has already garnered 13 CHA Player of the Week awards (4 off./5 def./4 rookie). That matches their award total of the entire 2006-07 season and accounts for over 54 percent of the weekly awards the league has doled out in 2007-08.



Offense / Forwards

Erickson- BSU D-I Points Leader

Luke Erickson scored two goals in BSU's March 10 CHA Tournament loss to Robert Morris, helping him wrap up his collegiate career with 52-69=121 points and solidify his place atop BSU Division I-era career scoring leaderboard.

Erickson is one of five players in BSU's Division I era to reach 100 career points scored, along with Andrew Murray (46-69=115; 2001-05) Brendan Cook (55-47=102, 2001-05), **Rob Sirianni** (48-53=101; 2003-07) and Marty Goulet (47-53=100, 1999-2003).

BSU's Top 20 Division I-era scorers can be found in the sidebar to the right.

Erickson Matches BSU Assist Mark

In addition to his BSU Division I-era career scoring record, **Luke Erickson** added a share of BSU's Division I-era career assists record to his resume as well. His third-period assist against Ala.-Huntsville on Feb. 16 was the 69th of his career, moving him even with Andrew Murray '05.

Murray, Erickson and Ryan Huddy (62) are the only three players in BSU's Division I era to reach 60 career assists.

Erickson Scores 50th Goal

Luke Erickson became the second player in BSU's Division I era to reach 50 goals scored for his career when he scored a second-period power-play goal against Ala.-Huntsville on Feb. 16. He finished his career second on BSU's Division I-era goal-scoring list with 52, just shy of Brendan Cook's record of 55 set from 2001-04.

Erickson Climbs CHA Scoring Lists

In addition to the BSU scoring lists, **Luke Erickson** spent his final season at Bemidji State continuing his climb up the College Hockey America career leaderboards for points scored and assists.

Erickson's 121 career points see him finish sixth all-time on the CHA career scoring lists, three points behind fifth-place Joe Tallari of Niagara (124, 2001-03).

Erickson also finished his career amongst CHA's all-time Top 10 in assists, as his BSU Division I-era record-tying 69 helpers have him tied with former teammate Andrew Murray (69, 2002-05) for sixth all-time on the CHA ledgers.

A Minnesota Flavor

Bemidji State's roster has a decidedly Minnesota flavor to it this season, with 11 players from the State of Hockey dotting its roster. This year's team is tied with the 1999-00 and 2001-02 squads for most Minnesotans on a roster in BSU's Division I era.

Scotfield and Jarvis Join 50-point club

The trip to New York turned out to be an initiation into the 50-point club for senior Blaine Jarvis and junior Tyler Scotfield. The pair becomes just the 17th and 18th members of the club in BSU's Division I era.

With a pair of goals and an assist in the Beavers' three-point weekend, Scotfield surpassed Jarvis tot total 52 career points, but Jarvis also managed a goal and an assist in the first game of the series to step into the group as well.

Scotfield, Jarvis and teammate Matt Pope (24-32=56) are the only current players to reach the 50-point plateau.

Sirianni Fifth to Century Mark

Rob Sirianni recorded two assists March 10 against Robert Morris in the final game of his collegiate career, with the first helper making him the fifth player in BSU's Division I era (since 1999) to reach 100 points scored for his career.

Sirianni capped his career with 48-53=101 points, and joined teammate Luke Erickson (121), Andrew Murray '05 (115), Brendan Cook '05 (102) and Marty Goulet '03 (100) in BSU's exclusive group of players who began their careers during BSU's Division I era and reached 100 points.

Sirianni finished third on BSU's Division I-era career list for goals scored (48) and tied for fourth in assists (53); Sirianni is one of just seven players in BSU's Division I era to reach 50 career assists and narrowly missed becoming just the third to reach 50 career goals.

Fourth-Line Production

Bemidji State used 13 different trios of forwards on its fourth line during the 2006-07 campaign, but regardless of lineups the fourth line was able to put points on the board.

BSU's fourth line contributed 15-26=41 points in 2006-07, an average of 1.24 points per game. The 1.24 point-per-game average of the fourth line was well ahead of the pace set by the 2005-06 fourth liners; in 37 games that year, BSU's fourth line scored 16-14=30 points (0.81 points per game). The 41 total points produced by fourth-liners in 2006-07 marked that line's highest season total over the last three years.

Winter, Scotfield on Soph Leaderboards

Travis Winter and **Tyler Scotfield** each assembled sophomore campaigns which found them amongst the Top 10 seasons by second-year players in BSU's Division I era.

Winter finished his sophomore campaign tied for the BSU lead with 12-17=29 points, the third-highest total by a sophomore since BSU made the jump to Division I in 1999; his 12 goals also are third-most in a single season by a BSU sophomore since 1999.

Scotfield scored 7-14=21 points and tied for ninth on BSU's Division I-era sophomore scoring charts.

Moggach, Read and Winter on CHA Charts

Forward **Joey Moggach** turned it up when the 2007-08 CHA season began and is averaging nearly a point per contest. His 1-7=8 points leads all league scorers while his seven assists nearly doubles his closest competition (4).

Joining Moggach among the CHA's top scorers are rookie Matt Read and junior alternate captain Travis Winter. The duo is tied for second place with six points scored in league play.

Pope Nets Pair of Winners at Wayne

Junior **Matt Pope** picked up the game-winning goal in each game of BSU's two-game series sweep at Wayne State on Dec. 1-2, giving him the game-winner in three of BSU's first five wins in 2006-07.

Pope became the fourth BSU player to score the game-winning goal in both ends of a weekend series, and the first since Andrew Martens did so in BSU's road series at Minn.-Duluth on Oct. 7-8, 2005.

He joined Jeff McGill, Brendan Cook and Martens as Beavers with game-winners in both games of a series. Cook is the only one of the four to turn the trick twice, doing so at Air Force in 2003-04 and against Robert Morris in 2004-05.

Beavers Lead CHA in Scoring Defense

Climie Garner's 30th Win

Matt Climie became just the second goaltender in BSU's Division I era to win 30 games when he posted a 3-1 win at Ala.-Huntsville on Feb. 3, 2006. He now sits seven wins behind Grady Hunt '04 for BSU's career Division I-era record.

Climie Posts Ninth Shutout

Matt Climie saved all 36 shots he faced in a 3-0 shutout of Alabama-Huntsville on Nov. 9, 2007, picking up his second shutout of the 2007-08 season and the ninth of his career. That ninth blanking extended his own BSU career Division I-era record, and moved him into a tie with Beavers greats Blaine Comstock and Jim Scanlan for the top spot on the career saves list at BSU (9).

Alamano Earns Victories in Relief

For the second time in 2006-07, **Orlando Alamano** entered a game at goaltender off the bench with BSU trailing Jan. 6 against Wayne State, and for the second time he backstopped BSU to a comeback victory. He saved 14 of 15 shots faced in a 38:35 relief appearance, picking up his second goaltending win off the bench since Dec. 9. In that contest, an eventual BSU victory at Minn.-Duluth, Alamano saved 29 of 30 shots faced in 49:46 of work to garner his second win of the year.

Alamano has been in goal for two of the three victories by a goaltender who entered the game in relief in BSU's Division I era. BSU's first Division I-era win off the bench came when **Matt Climie** backstopped a 4-2 win over Air Force on Jan. 7, 2005 after entering for Layne Sedevie.

Alamano Posts first career shut out

Junior goaltender **Orlando Alamano** got the 2007-08 season off on the right foot turning away 22 Army shots to record a 3-0 win in net. It was his first collegiate shut out.

Offensive Defender

Junior defenseman **Cody Bostock** has been a big factor for the Beavers on both ends of the ice. In addition to his duties in BSU's zone, he has been an offensive threat during the current conference season. His 2-2=4 points in league play is tops among CHA defenders while his two game-winning goals lead the league. The junior has already accumulated 3-3=6 points in 2007-08 to rank sixth on the team in scoring, equalling his goal-scoring mark of a year ago while coming within five points of his total scoring output as a sophomore.

BSU top 10 in goals allowed

Allowing just 2.07 goals per game this season, the stingy BSU defensive unit headed by Matt Climie is currently No. 7 in the country.



Special Teams

BSU on the Power Play

Bemidji State's power-play unit went 3-for-9 (.333) with the man advantage in its series versus Ala.-Huntsville Dec. 7-8 to improve to 12-for-66 on the power-play this season. The team has begun to heat things up on the man advantage as they have dipped into CHA play going 10-for-38 (.263) to rank second among conference teams. Its 10 power-play goals in CHA play laso paced the league.

BSU's power-play finished 2006-07 at .154 for the year and was fifth out of five teams in College Hockey America in power-play efficiency. BSU also finished fifth out of five teams in CHA in power-play goals scored with 31 a year ago.

BSU's .154 power play efficiency was 41st out of 59 Division I programs and was the lowest in BSU's Division I era (since 1999); its previous Division I-era low was .164 (24-146) in 2000-01.

BSU on the Penalty Kill

Bemidji State held the Chagters scoreless on seven power-play opportunities in the series final Dec. 8th and killed all 11 of UAH's opportunities on the weekend sitting behind only Robert Morris in penalty kill efficiency. The Beavers are 53-of-58 during the 2007-08 CHA season while RMU is just 21-of-23.

BSU's 2006-07 season penalty-kill finish the at .794 (181-228), behind CHA-leading Robert Morris (.823) and second-place Niagara (.813).

BSU finished 55th out of 59 Division I programs on the penalty kill in 2006-07, and over the team's final 17 games opponents went 25-for-108 (.231) against the Beavers with the man advantage.

BSU's .794 penalty kill was its lowest for a season since 2001-02, when the Beavers killed 128 of 165 opponent power-play chances, an efficiency of .776.

Power-Play Streaks

The Beavers enter the Minnesota State series after netting a totla of three power-play goals in the UAH series.

After scoring just two goals on the man advantage during their first eight games of the season, the Beavers have bounced back quite well. In the team's last eight games BSU has scored nine power-play goals. BSU is 5-1-2 in those. Coincidentally, BSU held its opponent without a power-play marker in each of their wins.

Short-Handed Goal Bullets

After skating through the first 13 games of the 20067-08 season without a short-handed goal, Bemidji State got one in each game of the Niagara series Nov. 30-Dec. 1. Matt Pope netted the Beavers first point down a man this season Friday in the 5-1 victory, while rookie Matt Read netted the first short-handed goal of his collegiate career to get the Beavers on the board the following evening.

In 2006-07, Travis Winter scored BSU's seventh short-handed goal of the season Feb. 17 against Ala.-Huntsville:

►BSU's seven short-handed goals in 2006-07 tied the program's Division I-era single-season record set in 2004-05.

►BSU's seven short-handed goals tied for 12th-most in the nation last year; Michigan led the nation in 2006-07 with 14 short-handed goals.

►The 2006-07 campaign marked the fourth consecutive year

BSU has scored six or more short-handed goals in a season; BSU scored only three in 2002-03.

BSU Faces Record Number of PPOs

Bemidji State continues its annual trend of facing more opponent power-play opportunities per game in 2007-08 but has seen the per-game average drop for the first time in six seasons to 5.68 PPO/gm after setting a BSU Division I-era record for three consecutive seasons.

The Beaver penalty kill faced an average of 6.91 opponent power-play chances per game in 2006-07, breaking the previous record of 6.84, set in 2005-06. It marked the third consecutive year BSU has faced a record number of penalty-kill situations, as the 2004-05 team faced 5.92 power-play chances per game. BSU was tasked with killing off 228 penalties in 2006-07, the second-highest single-season total in its Division I era and the third in a row facing more than 200.

BSU faced just 166 opponent power-play chances in 2001-02, or just 4.74 per game - both Division I-era lows.

Multiple Power-Play Goals

Bemidji State went 2-for-4 on the power play in its Dec. 7th victory over Ala.-Huntsville, marking the third time in 2007-08 that BSU scored multiple power-play goals in a contest. The Beavers are 2-1-0 in those games.

BSU went 2-3-1 last winter in games it scored more than one power-play goal.

The performance marked BSU's first losing record in games scoring multiple power-play goals since 1999-2000 - its first at the Division I level - when it 1-3-0 in four such games.

In its Division I era, BSU has posted a record of 39-16-4 when scoring more than one power-play goal in a game. The Beavers scored multiple power-play goals a Division I-era record 11 times in 2004-05, posting a record of 8-3-0.

Power-Play Shutouts

Bemidji State held Ala.-Huntsville without a power-play goal on four opportunities Friday and on seven chances Saturday marking the ninth and 10th times this season the Beavers have not allowed a power-play goal in a game.

The pair of wins helped the Beavers improve to 7-2-1 this season when its penalty kill shuts out an opponent.

BSU Academics

As Bemidji State has made inroads in its development as a Division I program, its progress in the classroom has been remarkable. In its sixth year under head coach Tom Serratore, the BSU program has become an academic juggernaut, annually dominating the Academic All-College Hockey America honor roll. In addition, BSU has had five College Sports Information Directors of America Academic All-District V selections over the last three years and has passed the NCAA's first two Academic Progress Rate performance checks with flying colors.

Overall, the BSU men's ice hockey team carries a cumulative GPA of 3.32.

NCAA Academic Progress Rate

Bemidji State men's hockey received a score of 980 in the Feb. 2006 release of the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate (APR) score on Feb. 28, 2005. BSU helped men's ice hockey achieve an aggregate score of 971, the fourth-highest of any men's sport in the Division in 2005.

The NCAA has established an APR cut rate of 925, which equates to a graduation rate of approximately 50 percent, for all NCAA Division I sports. Programs which failed to meet the cut rate risk reductions in scholarships.

Andrew Murray became the first player in CHA history to be named Player of the Year and Student-Athlete of the Year, picking up the historic sweep at the 2005 CHA awards banquet. Murray, a unanimous First-Team All-CHA pick, became the first BSU skater to be named CHA Student-Athlete of the Year.

Academic All-District V

Over the last five years, eight Beavers have been honored on the CoSIDA Academic All-District V At-Large Team. In 2005, Peter Jonsson became just the second BSU men's hockey player to be named Academic All-America. He was the only men's hockey player in the nation to earn First-Team laurels in 2005. He was a two-time Academic All-District V selection, so honored in 2004 and 2005.

BSU's other Academic All-District picks include Reily Weselowski (2006-07), Andrew Murray (2005), Bryce Methven (2003-04) and Bill Methven (2003).

Bemidji State's March 26, 2005 NCAA Tournament Northeast Regional semifinal match up against Denver marked the fourth time in its Division I era it faced a team ranked No. 1 in the nation in the USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Poll.

The Beavers played a two-game home-and-home series with St. Cloud State, dropping a 4-2 decision on home ice and losing 11-3 at the National Hockey Center. BSU vs Eventual Baker Winners

Three times since making the jump to Division I in 1999, Bemidji State has faced off against a player who has gone on to win the Hobey Baker Memorial Award, given annually to the most outstanding player in college hockey.

BSU's first such meeting came with 2002 winner Jordan Leopold of Minnesota. In a two-game Gopher sweep on Oct. 19-20, 2001, Leopold scored 1-4=5 points against BSU.
