Head Coach Steve Sertich



Steve Sertich enters his fourth season at Bemidji State. In his first season Sertich led the Beavers to an 11-20-5 overall record and a 9-15-4 record in Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA) play, good for a sixth-place finish. The 22 points he garnered during that first year was the most points Bemidji State has earned in conference play in its nine-year Division I era. He also led the Beavers to

its second win over the University of Minnesota in school history with a 2-0 shutout that was televised on Fox Sports Net North. Bemidji State compiled a six-game unbeaten streak, the longest unbeaten streak for the Beavers since the 2001-02 season.

Last year, coach Sertich compiled a 4-29-3 record and a 1-25-2 mark in the WCHA. The team recorded another shutout over a powerhouse, when the Beavers tied the then No. 2-ranked University of Wisconsin Badgers. This was the highest-ranked opponent to ever be shut out by a BSU squad.

Sertich came to Bemidji State University after spending 13 years as the head varsity coach at Roseville Area High School. He coached the Roseville boys' team from 1993-2003, leading it to a 156-71-11 record and two Minnesota State tournament appearances. Under Sertich's guidance, Roseville finished third in the 2002 tournament and second in 2003. He led Roseville to Suburban East Conference Championships in 2002 and 2003. Sertich earned four Coach of the Year honors, as he was named Section 3AA boys' Coach of the Year in 1999, Section 2AA Boys' Coach of the Year in both 2002 and 2003, and Class AA Coach of the Year in 2003.

In 2003, Sertich moved to head coach of the Roseville girls' varsity team and in three seasons led the program to a record of 62-21-2. The Roseville girls finished fourth in the 2006 state tournament and captured Suburban East Conference titles in both '04 and '05. Sertich was named the 2004 Section 2AA Girls' Coach of the Year. Sertich began his coaching career in 1976 as the head boys' varsity coach at Northfield (Minn.) High School, and over the next 20 years he would hold a variety of head and assistant coaching positions at the high school, college and national levels.

Sertich began his playing career with the Colorado College Tigers in 1970 and assembled a standout four-year career.

Sertich was a member of the U.S. National Team from 1973-75, and played on a team which trained in Bemidji. He was also a member of the 1976 U.S. Olympic team, which finished fifth at the Innsbruck, Austria games.

He also played two years in the German Professional League, spending the 1974-75 season as captain for Fussen and two seasons from 1978-80 playing for Nurnburg.

About Mercyhurst (cont.)

- Mercyhurst returns 15 members from last year's squad including junior forward Jesse Scanzano, who was second on the team in scoring. Scanzano scored 62 points last year netting 27 goals and collecting 35 assists.
- Among the players lost for Mercyhurst are two of the top three scorers from last year. Meghan Agosta and Valerie Chouinard accounted for a combined 123 points, which was almost 27 percent of the Lakers total offense last year.

Series against Mercyhurst

- This will be the sixth weekend meeting between the two teams. The last time the teams met was for a weekend series back in 2005 that saw the Beavers tie one game and lose the other.
- Mercyhurst holds the advantage in the series going 1-7-2 against Bemidji State.

Rebuilding for Success

- The Bemidji State women's hockey team is looking to keep improving on its successes coming off a rebuilding season that saw the Beavers go 6-25-5 and 2-22-3 in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA) in the 2008-09 season. After losing 14 returning players after the 2007-08 season, the young team was launched into a high level of competition most freshmen don't get to see.

Slovakian Sensation

- Beaver goaltender **Zuzana Tomcikova** (So, Bratislava, Slovakia) will be playing for the Slovakian National Women's Hockey Team in the 2010 Winter Olympics in Vancouver.
- Her success on the ice last year didn't go unnoticed as she was the first player in WCHA history to be honored with Defensive Player of the Week three times in a row (Dec. 10 - Jan. 7).
- She was also named to the 2008-09 All-WCHA Rookie Team and 2008-09 All-WCHA Second Team, which was the highest individual award won by a BSU women's hockey player.
- She posted a .915 save percentage, while making a league-best 882 saves in conference play.
- Her 1025 overall saves last year was second only to the 1072 saves former Beaver goalie Emily Brookshaw made in 2007-08.
- Tomcikova also had three shutouts last year, tying the school record for most shutouts in a season.

Veteran Sophomores

- Bemidji State has 10 sophomores that all saw action as true-freshmen last year.
- **Montana Vichorek** (Def., Cloquet, Minn.) was recognized by the WCHA last year garnering Rookie Player of the Week on Jan. 28, 2009.
- Vichorek led all freshmen and was third on the team in scoring with 13 points (3G 10A).
