

How to interpret your
Transfer Evaluation

Your transfer evaluation includes information on how your previous post-secondary credits are accepted by Bemidji State University. You will find the following information detailed on your transfer evaluation.

Transfer Summary – The Transfer Summary indicates the total number of credits accepted by BSU.

A – Indicates the term the course was taken at the transfer institution.

C – Credits
D - Grade received. TB = Transfer B grade.
E – First line includes the title of the course as it appears on the transfer institution’s transcript. The second line indicates which institution the course was transferred from (CLC) and the transfer course subject and number.
