HEALTH CONTENT & PELSB LICENSURE STANDARDS REVIEW

PLEASE use the **HEALTH LICENSURE CHECKLIST** for currently licensed teachers as a guide.

Send applicable unofficial transcripts to Shannon Norman at Shannon.Norman@bemidjistate.edu for INITIAL evaluation. **OFFICIAL transcripts are REQUIRED on file for licensure with admissions office.** Request official transcripts from institutions where courses may apply to health content. The process to obtain a health license may change at any time to comply with current MN PELSB requirements.

MN PELSB licensure mandates: Teachers with a standard teaching license, who complete Health Content courses to add a health license (5-12), must meet **Reading Standards & student teach 4 consecutive weeks in health.** Minimum 2.5 GPA in BSU courses required to student teach. Student teaching cannot be waived. Contact Director of Clinical Experiences, Renae Spangler Renae.Spangler@bemidjistate.edu Department of Professional Education, to request student teaching proposal information. Address: 1500 Birchmont Dr. NE #35, Bemidji, MN 56601; Phone: 218.755.3733 (or obtain from Health Content Advisor). **This step must take place at least ONE semester PRIOR to the semester you plan to student teach.**
