## The process to obtain a health license may change at any time to comply with current MN PELSB requirements.

MN PELSB licensure mandates: Teachers with a standard teaching license, who complete Health Content courses to add a health license (5-12), must meet Reading Standards & student teach 4 consecutive weeks in health. Minimum 2.5 GPA in BSU courses required to student teach. Student teaching cannot be waived. Contact Director of Clinical Experiences, Renae Spangler Renae.Spangler@bemidjistate.edu Department of Professional Education, to request student teaching proposal information. This step must take place at least ONE semester PRIOR to the semester you plan to student teach.
