





*People should support country even if wrong.





*How important: to have (Country Nationality) ancestry




Female	Russia	US

Measuring and comparing Pride/Patriotism

Somewhat proud	46.8%	56.4%
Not very proud	16.3%	6.4%
Not proud at all	5.5%	3.1%
Male respondents	Russia	US
Very proud	27.4%	42.2%
Somewhat proud	47.4%	47.5%
Not very proud	18.7%	7.5%
Not proud at All	6.5%	2.8%
