Testing Requirements for Licensure: Pedagogy and Content (for initial license)

- K-12 candidates may choose either Elementary Pedagogy or Secondary Pedagogy.
- Elementary candidates should take MTLE Elementary Pedagogy Subtests 1 and 2.
- Secondary (5-12) candidates should take MTLE Secondary Pedagogy Subtests 1 and 2.
- No one should take the "Early Childhood" Pedagogy tests.
- 5-12 Science programs result in both General Science (5-8) AND Science Specialty (9-12).

required in ED 4799 The Professional Teacher (taken the semester before student teaching).

- Campus Science candidates should take MTLE Content tests for both Middle Level Science and their 9-12 Science Specialty.
- FasTrack students who are only completing a 9-12 Science Specialty do not need to take the Middle Level Science Content Tests.

Note: Minnesota requires passing scores on the MTLE Basic Skills (or equivalent) exams before issuing a Tier 4 license. These tests are not required for admission to the Professional Education program or for initial licenses (Tier 2 and Tier 3). However, candidates must have passing scores on the basic skills tests to receive a Tier 4 license.
