

Centralized scheduling phase-in

During the 2014-2015 academic year, we will continue to work with a consultant who will make recommendations regarding how to schedule classes in time periods to minimize scheduling conflicts for students. Those recommendations will be shared with faculty and staff for comment as they come forward throughout the year.

At the end of this time period, we plan to couple those recommendations with the scheduling software (EMS) to schedule classes that:

1. Minimize conflicts for students
2. Increase space utilization on campus
3. Honor the need to have space dedicated to meet distinctive and unique programmatic needs

The goal is to pilot this system for education classes in the fall of 2015 and for the campus as a whole the fall of 2016.
