

Over the same time period (2016-17), students in the \$30,001-48,000 range showed an uncharacteristic peak in awards just *above* the \$10,000 amount; a full 48% of these students received award amounts in excess of \$10,000. This increase in the central values of the award amounts pushed the average to a higher than expected value – higher, in fact, than the same average for the \$0-30,000 income group. In summary: it wasn't that the flagged amount was too small, it was that the nearest comparison group was too large.
