
## SPRING SESSION 2022 - HYFLEX



An examination of the influence history, geography, economy, political, environmental, and social factors have on members of another culture as reflected by their values, beliefs, practices, and perspectives. This course also serves as pre-immersion preparation for students participating in either of the Summer Short-Term Study-in-China programs (see below) (pending travel restriction lift). We will explore preparation for international travel, basic understanding of the sociopolitical structure of China, and cultural and historical background of the region where students will visit.

- Global Health Perspectives (May 15-June 12, 2023) in Nanjing University of Chinese Medicine, Nanjing, Jiangsu Province, China
- **History of Mixed Economy (June 12- July 10, 2023)** in Guizhou University, Guiyang, Guizhou Province, China

There is a high likelihood that travel to China will not be permitted in summer 2022. Despite this limitation, students are encouraged to enroll in INTL 2100 where we will develop insights into our own cultural rules and biases and value our interactions with culturally different individuals. We will bring global learning to you, wherever you are, by bringing faculty from our Chinese partners to introduce Traditional Chinese Medicine, urbanization in China, etc. Through collaboration with the American Indian Resource Center, you will also be introduced to other health beliefs such as Traditional Indigenous Healing. Our goal is to be culturally responsive members of the community.

This course is offered Hyflex, allowing students to participate in class on campus or online. You choose the method that is right for you. The course will be offered on Mondays and Wednesdays from 4:00 - 5:30 in S 331 and via Zoom.
