


Bed Lofts

- One option residents personalize their residence hall room is to loft their bed. If you are considering this option, you may elect to rent a bed lofting kit.
 - This may be selected through your housing application. Simply select yes to the loft option after you select your room in June and our staff will loft your bed before you arrive!
 - Applications requesting lofts received by August 1 will be guaranteed set up on arrival.
 - Due to safety concerns, as well as damage to the rooms, construction of personal bed lofts will not be permitted.









Housing Application & Roommates

- The Housing Application is online in e-Services under the "Housing and Dining" tab
- Students get to choose their own roommates
 - If choosing a specific roommate, their pair should be finalized in the housing application by June 1 to make room selection a breeze.
 - Can start forming roommate pairs now
 - Housing Application on e-Services
- How to find a roommate
 - Can search for potential roommates in different ways:
 - By Detail (name, student or Star ID, age)
 - By Profiles (narrow down roommates based on one or more of their profile questions)
 - Suggested Roommates (based on highest % match of profile questions)

- Want to contact a potential roommate?
 - Can send a message to that person directly from the Housing Application
 - Once a roommate request is sent, it needs to be accepted by the other student in order to finalize the pair
 - Once accepted a request, the student will not be able to join another roommate pair
- Selecting a room
 - Either of the roommates can make the room assignment for both roommates during room selection (mid-June)
- Remember if it goes sideways once the school year starts, there is staff here to help!



Room Selection

- Students get to choose their room!
- Timeline
 - **By June 1:** Finalize your roommate pair. Pairs are not required but are helpful when selecting a room.
 - **By June 8:** Make sure your application is complete. Verify this by viewing your status on the first page of your app.
 - June 10: Room selection timeslots are assigned. An email notification will contain your assigned room selection timeslot. Timeslots will be based on your app completion date. Please see the timeslot schedule below.





Parking Information

- PICK AFTER YOU SELECT YOUR ROOM AND BUILDING
- Residential permits include Red (Birch/Linden Lot), Black (Cedar Lot), Blue (Oak Lot), Yellow (Rec. Center Lot) and Orange (Walnut Lot). Residential Lot permits are only available for purchase by individuals residing in residence halls.
- Red: Sold only to Birch and Linden residents and usable in the Birch/Linden, Rec., Walnut and Oak Lots. Limited availability.
- Yellow: Available only to Birch, Linden and Tamarack residents and usable in the Rec., Walnut and Oak Lots. Limited availability.
- Black: Available first to Cedar Apartments residents, but depending on demand, may be available to other residence-hall students. Limited availability.
- Orange: Available to Birch, Linden, Tamarack and Pine residents and usable in the new Walnut Lot west of Walnut Hall, as well as the Oak Lot. Limited availability.
- Blue: Available to any residence hall student but usable *only* in the Oak Hall Lot. This is also the *only* residence-hall parking available for Oak.

- Replacement for a lost ID costs \$20.



Weapon & Basic Storage

Weapon Storage:

We recently expanded our on-campus weapon storage facility in Walnut Hall to better serve our resident students who take advantage of the outdoor activities available in Minnesota's northwoods.


Resident students who make use of the room will have keys for individual lockers, but access to the room is controlled by the university's Office of Campus Security and Safety. The room will be monitored 24 hours a day by surveillance equipment.

The weapon storage facility complements the university's nearby wild game cleaning room, which includes all facilities a hunter or angler would need to clean his or her game. Together, the facilities provide a complete resource to support students who participate in hunting and fishing activities.

Pine Hall Basic Storage:

Storage space for personal belongings is available in the lower level of Pine Hall. Locker sign up is completed at the Housing & Residential Life Office in Walnut Hall with access to the space available during office hours.

Typical locker size is 8' (H) x 21" (W) x 35" (D)




